





## Water resources per capita in the Mediterranean countries



#### **Exploitation indices of renewable natural resources by 2025**



By 2025: the Mediterranean water poor population could reach 244 million, 44 % of total Mediterranean population

Exploitation index means the ratio of annual volume extracted from natural resources / annual volume of renewable natural resources , expressed as a percentage (%)

#### There is a need to:



- meet the MDG/ WSSD target of halving the proportion of people without access to safe drinking water and sanitation by 2015
- meet the WSSD target on national IWRM plans and strengthen the regional IWRM framework
- voice/convey water concerns in national development plans and integrate them in policies of related sectors
- build synergies and boost commitment to action by setting up active water partnerships at regional and national level
- further develop tools, build capacity, raise public awareness and educate on water issues

- Political will and investment



#### **GWP-Med Goal**

- To promote action and exchange knowledge on IWRM for the sustainable use of water resources in the countries of the Mediterranean region
- To facilitate a multi-stakeholder regional water partnership acting as a platform for interaction
- -To facilitate stakeholder engagement and donors' support for dialogue and action to promote IWRM at national and regional levels
- To make the principles of sustainable water use and IWRM widely recognised and applied, through information & experience sharing

**GWP-Med Role** 

To act as a broker, a catalyst, a facilitator and an advocacy organisation

- River Basin Organisations represent the key level of management the local water management.
- The multi-stakeholder regional water partnership within GWP-Med, has benefited substantially from MENBOs active engagement in its activities.
- MENBO is a very active Member of the GWP-Med Partnership Council since 2002.
- MENBO is an Activity Leader in the GWP-Med Work Plans, every year since 2003. Emphasis of activities is on building the capacity of the RBOs network (Valencia, Marrakech, Athens, etc).
- Further targeted collaboration on pilot activities at the local level is under discussion.
