#### **General Information**

#### 1. Entry Requirements for Mexico

Participants holding a Diplomatic Passport do not require a visa to enter Mexico. We recommend you consult the Consulate or Embassy of Mexico in your respective countries to check if need apply for visa. #### 3. Voltage

Electrical appliances in Mexico run on 110 volts.

#### 4. Currency

The official currency in Mexico is the Peso. The exchange rate varies and is currently at approximately \$13.18 per U.S. dollar MNX.

#### **Mexico City**

#### 1. Location

Mexico City is highly privileged, offering what few other cities can: culture, nature, tourist sites, educational and medical services, religious sites, entertainment and nightlife. Located in central Mexico (99 ° 09 'west longitude, 19 ° 24'' north latitude, GMT -6), the city is surrounded by mountains and can be found on the site of an ancient lake, at an average altitude of 2,300m above sea level.

#### 2. Language

Spanish is the official language spoken by most of the city's inhabitants. However, given its pre-Hispanic roots, you can regularly hear indigenous languages such as Nahuatl, Zapotec or Mixtec, as well as foreign languages - mainly English, Chinese, Korean, French or German.

#### 3. Population

The population of Mexico City is 17.6 million people, approximately 17% of the total population of the country.

#### 4. Climate

In December, temperatures in Mexico City range between 5°C (41°F) and 17°C (62.6°F).

#### 5. Transport Airport - Hotel

The distance from the International Airport to the city center is roughly 15 miles and takes around 30 minutes by taxi.

We recommend using authorized taxi services from Mexico City International Airport; their offices can be found inside the airport building. These services operate with fixed rates and the price for the distance to the proposed hotel is around \$152.00 pesos (\$12.00 USD). Taxis can be found at gates 1 and 10 in Terminal 1 and gates 3 and 4 in Terminal 2.









For transport to other sites around Mexico City, we recommend using authorized taxis services. Either ask at your hotel for a shuttle service or use one of the taxi services below:

#### 6. Schedules

The time zone corresponds to GMT -6 in the winter months.

- Activity/Business in the city generally begins at 5am until after 12pm.
- Most shopping centers and services are open from 9am to 8pm, Monday to Sunday.
- The banks are open for a shorter time from 9am to 4pm Monday to Friday. However, there is an extensive network of ATMs.
- The vast majority of museums and tourist sites are open from 9am to 5pm, Tuesday to Sunday, when many of them are free.
- Public transport services operate from 5am to 12pm.
