Description

Water security is a condition whereby there is reliable availability of water resources –in both quality and quantity– to sustain the health and livelihoods of populations, to foster an inclusive socio-economic development, to preserve ecosystem services and, more broadly, to achieve sustainable development. Water security also means that water related risks are managed to the point of being socially acceptable.

As such a polity's capacity for water security increasingly depends on a range of societal forces that if coordinated, to enable cooperation and synergies, can help to attain it in a timely and efficient manner.

This seminar will explore the notion of water security from different, but complementary angles of water resources management. It will bring to the fore the experience of several organisations working in the pursuit of water security across the Latin American and Caribbean Region. The session will highlight the need for greater cooperation and will seek to reinforce existing partnerships to support water security in the Region.
