African Network Of Basin Organization

- The African Network of Basin Organizations (ANBO) was <u>created</u> on the occasion of <u>its Inaugural General Assembly</u> held in <u>Dakar</u>, <u>Senegal</u>, <u>Africa</u> from <u>10th to 11th July 2002</u> as an International Non-Profit Organization.
- ANBO was <u>created to respond to the need to coordinate</u> and <u>strengthen cooperation among African Basin Organizations</u>.

Demonstrates the <u>transformative power of water cooperation</u> in fostering peace, driving prosperity and nurturing sustainable development

A Regional Intergovernmental partnership established by the Nile Basin Countries in 1999 to manage and develop the shared the Nile Basin water resources in a cooperative manner ensuring equitable utilization of the available water resources.

NBI has 3 core functions

Basin Cooperation actively provides the first and only all-inclusive and neutral regional platform for Member States to discuss with trust and confidence, how to collectively take care of and jointly use the shared Nile Basin water and related resources

<u>Water Resources Management</u> strengthens Member States' institutional and technical capacities and provides shared knowledge bases to support decision making and action at local levels.

Water Resources Development core function assists Member States to identify and prepare investment projects

 - ✓ Irrigation projects in Kagera, Mara and Sio-Malaba-Malakisi sub-basins
- Environmental sustainability
 - ✓ Restored watersheds Over 40,000 hectares
- Transboundary Water Governance
 - ✓ Increased trust and confidence, dialogue and engagement, capacity to cooperate, enabling environment
